Dear Mr. Humphrey

Thank you for your recent letter setting out your concerns about finding a joined up solution for managing wastewater flooding in St Mary Bourne. When we discussed the scheme with Southern Water, we too expressed our concerns that this project did not provide a long term solution to the problems that St Marybourne and the wider catchment experiences.

You will be aware that during last winter we refused to allow similar emergency discharges of this type to rivers and streams throughout North Hampshire and insisted Southern Water managed flows within their sewer network using tankers. We are obviously aware of the disruption that increased tankering can cause in small villages and it is clearly not a sustainable option in the longer term, but I trust this reassures you that we do not see discharges to the Bourne, or similar environments, as an easy option and will continue to take this issue seriously.

As you will be aware Southern Water are now reviewing their proposals and we will, of course, be part of this work looking to help identify and promote the best long term solution for the people and environment of St Mary Bourne
